Course Description: We live in an active and changing world that holds both promise and peril for the international system. This course is designed to provide you with some of the analytical concepts and tools necessary to make sense of the various issues facing the international system today. To do this, the course is divided into four sections. In the first section, we will cover some of the basic events that have shaped our world and the concepts and theories that are used to help explain these events and predict the future. The final three sections of the course will build upon this foundation and examine the international system in the areas of international conflict, international political economy, and transnational politics.

Course Objectives: This is a general education course with both global (GL) and social and behavioral science (GSB) markers, and the student learning objectives for this course have been designed with both in mind. By the end of this course you should be able to:

- Define different types of actors and identify their interests within the international system.
- Explain how these actors interact within the areas of international conflict, international political economy, and transnational politics.
- Apply theories of international relations--e.g., realism, liberalism, and constructivism--to explain and predict outcomes within these areas of international politics.

Grades:

There is a possible total of 1000 points for the course. The assignments are divided in this fashion:

There will be 8 Discussion Forums (listed as DF) and each DF will be worth 30 points. To receive the full 30 points, you must first post an original response to the discussion question and then you must post at least one thoughtful (That means something far beyond simply telling your classmate you agree with them.) response to a classmate's post. There will be two discussion forums for each of units 1-4. All of these posts will be done within your groups. Click on the People icon on the left of the Canvas opening page for the class to find your group. Tell me right away if you have not been assigned to a group.

The first discussion board post to each forum must be posted by each Wednesday night at 11:59 PM. Your response to a classmate and any other discussion must be posted by 11:59 each Sunday night. Anything posted over 48 hours late will not be graded and you will receive a zero. Late work will be penalized.

You should consider these posts formal writing. I expect proper grammar and real paragraphs. Please check for typos before you hit SUBMIT. Any more than one stray typo will mean deductions from your grade for the post. If you need help with your writing, please consult with the Writing Center. Here is their web page:

Tests:
